- 2. What does the word "tribulation" mean? How long will this tribulation period last? (See Daniel 9:24-27)
- 3. Read Matthew 24 (Olivet Discourse) and compare its details to Revelation 6. What does it mean in Mt. 24:8 that "all these things are merely the beginning of birth pangs"? What happens after birth pangs? How bad will it be on earth when God pours out His wrath before Jesus returns?
- 4. What are the implications of the white horse, rider with bow (no arrows mentioned), a crown given to him, and conquering? What will it be like at the beginning of the Tribulation period?
- 5. What are the implications of the second horse and rider?
- 6. Have you ever experienced a famine? How quickly can a famine come? Think back when the Covid pandemic started and the difficulty of getting food or even toilet paper. What would happen if basic food for one person cost your entire salary? How would you feed your family? What might people do when they are starving?
- 7. What is meant by "do not damage the oil and the wine"? What might extremely poor people do in circumstances like that?
- 8. What would it be like if ¼ of the current world's population died in a short amount of time? How many people would that be? Where would they be buried?
- 9. By what means do that many people die? Note: the word "pestilence" is the word "death" earlier in verse 8. Why would wild beasts start killing people?
- 10. What should the response be of those who survive the first four seals? What keeps people from doing that? (See Eph. 2:1-3; 4:17-19; 2 Cor. 4:3-4)
- 11. Assuming Pastor Paul is right about a Pre-Tribulational rapture... If the Tribulation judgments started this week, list the names of people you know who would still be here and have to go through it (or die in it). Prayerfully make plans to share the Gospel with them. Invite them to Good Friday and Easter services.

2. Seal 2: Warfare and Bloodshed (6:3-4)

3. Seal 3: Widespread Famine (6:5-6)

4. Seal 4: Death to a Fourth of Earth's Inhabitants (6:7-8)

⁷ When the Lamb broke the fourth seal, I heard the voice of the fourth living creature saying, "Come." ⁸ I looked, and behold, an ashen horse; and he who sat on it had the name Death; and Hades was following with him. Authority was given to them over a fourth of the earth, to kill with sword and with famine and with pestilence and by the wild beasts of the earth.
