

5. Amillennialists believe in a two-age model: this present age and the age to come (Mt. 12:32; Mk. 10:30; Lk. 18:30). Why do premillennialists believe in an Intermediate Age (millennial kingdom) between this present Church Age and the Eternal State? (See Ps. 72; Is. 2:2-4 cf. Micah 4:1-3; Is. 11:1-9; 65:17-25; Zech. 8:4-5; 14:16-19; Is. 24:21-23)
6. How does Acts 1:1-11 support Premillennialism? Note that Jesus spent 40 days after He was resurrected speaking to His disciples of the kingdom of God. What is the one question they ask Him after 40 days discussing the kingdom of God (v. 6). If the church had replaced Israel in fulfillment of prophecies, why didn't Jesus just say so at that time? Does He say they are wrong in their understanding that the kingdom will be restored to Israel in the future? Why not?
7. How does Romans 9-11 support Premillennialism? Note how Paul starts with an overwhelming concern for national Israel. Note that throughout Romans 9-11, Paul maintains a distinction between literal, national Israel and the Church. Why does he say in 9:3-4 that all the advantages he lists still belong to Israel? Why does he say in 11:12 there will be a "fulfillment" for national Israel? When will the fullness of the Gentiles be? When will Israel be grafted back into the tree of the Abrahamic Covenant? (See Zech. 12-14) In what sense are the gifts and calling of God as it pertains to national Israel irrevocable? How will Jesus reigning on a throne in Jerusalem, in a literal physical kingdom, showcase His mercy and wisdom to the world?
8. Since God is going to fulfill His promises to Israel, how does that help you trust Him for His promises to you? What are some specific promises He has made to the church? How do they help you while living in a world that is still under the curse of sin?
9. We all agree that Jesus is coming back. Are you ready to meet Him? Do you know for sure that you will be with Him in His kingdom? Are you sure? How do you know?
10. Our theme this year is PRAYER. Bring a prayer journal to church every week and ask at least one person for specific prayer requests. Pray throughout the week and check back the following Sunday.

4. What is an unconditional covenant? What are some unconditional covenants in the Bible? Why do Premillennialists believe that these covenants will be fulfilled literally in a future nation of Israel in the millennial kingdom? (See Dan. 2:44; 9:24-27; Ezek. 34-39; Zech. 12-14)
