I. What is a witness?

- A. Webster's:
 - 1. Noun = one that gives evidence; one who has personal knowledge of something; public affirmation by word or example of faith or conviction
 - 2. Verb = to testify to; to act as legal witness of; to furnish proof of; to bear witness to one's religious convictions

B. Greek:

- Martures = a witness who has observed something on a firsthand basis, by seeing, hearing, knowing, or experiencing in some way (Lk. 24:48; Acts 7:58; 1 Thess. 2:10; 2 Tim. 2:2)
- 2. Martureo = the action of bearing witness (John 15:27; 5:33; 18:37; 1 John 1:1-4; Rev. 12:11)
- 3. Marturia = testimony, usually in a verbal sense (John 1:19; Acts 22:18; Rev. 12:10; John 5:34)
- 4. Marturion = that which serves as a testimony or proof (Mk. 13:9; Lk. 21:13; 1 Tim. 2:6; Acts 4:33; 2 Tim. 1:8)
- A Christian witness then is *"someone who by firsthand experience (seeing, hearing experiencing)* can establish the reality and certainty of Jesus Christ."

- B. Because of the ______ of all men: Matthew 9:36-38; 13:49-50; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-10; 1 Peter 4:17-18; Jude 23; Revelation 20:15.
- C. Because of the ______ of the gospel: Matthew 7:13; 13:49-50; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-10; 1 Peter 4:17-18; Jude 23; Revelation 20:15.
- D. Because of the ______ of Christ: 1 Corinthians 15:58; 2 Corinthians 5:10-11; 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20.
- E. Because of the ______ of love: II Corinthians 5:14 (cf. Paul's example in Romans 9:1-3; 10- 1).
- F. Because of the ______ of the gospel: It is the only thing that works! Acts 4:12; Romans 1:14-16
- G. Because of the ______ of the message to us: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23; 2 Corinthians 5:18-20; 1 Thessalonians 2:4-8; 1 Timothy 1:11-16.

FINAL OBSERVATIONS:

• Four things about the woman:

- 1. She had ancestors that knew the God of Abraham, Isaac & Jacob. She knew the jargon that passed down from them ("prophet," etc.).
- 2. She had never been substantially influenced by the religion of Israel.
- 3. Her life was somewhat out of control. (five husbands, now a live-in boyfriend)
- 4. She was a "worshiper." She asked important questions but not always in the language of Israel.

• Many people in America are like that today!

- 1. They had ancestors that knew about Christianity!
 - Religious training in background
 - 1952 6% said no
 - 1981 21% said no
 - 1988 25% said no
 - 1993 33% said no
 - 2000 40% said no
- 2. People are exposed to Christianity, but it has no influence on the way they live
 - o 140 million secular people in America above age 14
 - America is 3rd largest mission field in the world (behind China & India)
 - 80% of churches are declining; 19% are growing by church transfer; only 1% are growing by conversion even though people are asking more religious questions than ever!

- 3. People are out of control! (Drugs, sex, materialism, etc.)
- 4. People today are worshipers! (Nature, cults, occult, Islam, etc.)
- What will it take to reach secular people in America today? Five questions:
- 1. Do we want to know secular people? (Jews did not associate with Samaritans)
- 2. Do we want secular people in our churches?
 - People that are not refined
 - People that are out of control and make us uncomfortable
- 3. Are we willing to go where they are? Are we truly on a Mission from God?
- 4. Are we willing to spend time with them?
- 5. Would we be willing to let them be a part of our church (hang ups and all)?

• What do we learn from Jesus?

- 1. He began where she was instead of where He wanted her to be
- 2. He engaged her in CONVERSATION (honest, open, two-way)
- 3. He used her language
- 4. He was genuinely interested in her. People are amazed to find out that God is interested in them.
- 5. He treated her with respect & dignity
- 6. He made her aware of her need & let her know that He could meet it!
